
24 FANTASTIC FEBRUARY READS!







Two men arrive on an Irish island - a painter and a linguist both hoping to capture the essence of the place and its people. But before summer is out, there will be a reckoning. A spare and beautifully observed novel set against the backdrop of The Troubles.



THE COLD MILLIONS BY JESS WALTER FICTION - 10TH FEB

Penguin £8.99

Two brothers, both itinerant workers, are holed up in Spokane, Washington in 1909, just as labour agitators are whipping up the local workforce. A rip-roaring, tragicomic novel with shades of westerns, adventure, family saga and satire, perfect for fans of *The Sisters Brothers*.

OPEN WATER BY CALEB AZUMAH NELSON FICTION - 3RD FEB

Penguin £8.99



Swift £12.99

The Black Country, 1870. Michael works two brutal mining jobs, hopeful of a better future for his son. Everything seems to be slipping away...until he strikes gold. A spare and beautiful debut novel, perfect for fans of Benjamin Myers and Claire Keegan.

Hodder & Stoughton £7.99

Room meets Misery in this taut tale of a woman held captive in a British farmhouse. When she finds herself pregnant, she vows to escape, no matter the cost. An achingly tense thriller from one of the rising stars of UK crime



THE LEVIATHAN BY ROSIE ANDREWS FICTION - 3RD FEB

Bloomsbury £14.99

Norfolk, 1643: Thomas Treadwater has been summoned home from the civil war to attend to a family mystery. But what he uncovers is something dark and ancient, linked to a shipwreck years before. A gorgeously written tale of myth and murder set at a time of religious and political upheaval.

THE GIFTS BY LIZ HYDER FICTION - 17TH FEB

A dark, twisty, gothic tale of women growing wings, and a doctor's descent into madness at the obsession of discovery, of fame, of his gift from God. In her true fashion, Hyder has crafted a multilayered, atmospheric novel which fans of Laura Purcell will love!




WHEN WE WERE BIRDS BY AYANNA LLOYD BANWO FICTION - 10TH FEB






BY KEY DICK FICTION - 3RD FEB






DANCE MOVE BY WENDY ERSKINE **SHORT STORIES - 17TH FEB**






THREE MOTHERS BY ANNA MALAIKA TUBBS BIOGRAPHY - 3RD FEB

Bonnier Books £16.99






MIGHT BITE By Patrick Foster Memoir - 3rd feb






WE ARE BELLINGCAT By Eliot Higgins True Crime - 17th Feb





BAD FOOD: GAME OF SCONES BY ERIC LUPER CHILDREN'S GRAPHIC NOVEL 6+-

Faber & Faber £7.99


