
The sun is starting to peek through the clouds here in Bath, and with it comes an explosion of incredible new books on our shelves! These are just a few we've been sticking our noses into this month...



YELLOWFACE By Rebecca F. Kuang Fiction - 25th May

When Athena Liu, darling of the publishing industry, dies in a freak accident, her colleague June steals her manuscript and publishes it under a pseudonym... with hideous consequences. A razor-sharp, bitingly satirical first literary novel from one of the giants of fantasy.



THE COVENANT OF WATER BY ABRAHAM VERGHESE FICTION - 18TH MAY

Atlantic Books £20

An epic and sweeping multigenerational family drama as only Verghese can write. This, his first novel for 14 years, follows one Indian family – each generation of which has suffered a death by drowning – through the course of the 20th century.

SMALL WORLDS By Caleb Azumah Nelson Fiction - 11th May

Penguin £14.99



Civil Townsend is a young Black nurse trying to make a difference in her first job at a family planning clinic in 1970s Alabama. But she is about to unearth a scandal that will rock the nation. A beautiful, heartfelt tale of family, love and community.



GRIMMISH BY MICHAEL WINKLER FICTION - 4TH MAY

VERGE Bynadia attia Fiction - 11th May






VENOMOUS LUMPSUCKER BY NED BEAUMAN FICTION - 4TH MAY

Hodder & Stoughton £20








THIS IS NOT MIAMI BY FERNANDA MELCHOR TRUE CRIME - 10TH MAY



ALL THE FLOWERS KNEELING By Paul Tran Poetry - 4th May








MY NAME IS SUNSHINE SIMPSON BY G.M. LINTON CHILDREN'S 8+ - 11TH MAY
