

Picnics in the park, barbeques in the garden, maybe even a little early Summer break - all joys which June brings, and all made better by a brand-new book!


Here are the books we're most excited about this coming June

TOMORROW AND TOMORROW AND TOMORROW BY GABRIELLE ZEVIN FICTION - 29TH JUNE










FIGHT NIGHT BY MIRIAM TOEWS FICTION - 1ST JUNE

HORSE BY GERALDINE BROOKS FICTION - 2ND JUNE


Little, Brown £9.99








THE QUEEN OF DIRT ISLAND BY DONAL RYAN FICTION - 15TH JUNE




PIZZA PETE AND THE PERILOUS POTIONS BY CARRIE SELLON CHILDREN'S 8+ - 8TH JUNE
