




GREEK LESSON By han kang fiction - 1st february






BRUTES BY DIZZ TATE FICTION - 1ST FEBRUARY

A SIGN OF HER OWN BY SARAH MARSH FICTION - 1ST FEBRUARY






HOW I WON A NOBEL PRIZE BY JULIUS TARANTO FICTION - 15TH FEBRUARY






NOBODY'S ANGEL By Jack Clark Fiction - 13th February

JONATHAN ABERNATHY YOU ARE KIND BY MOLLY MCGHEE FICTION - 1ST FEBRUARY








THE SUN WALKS DOWN BY FIONA MCFARLANE FICTION - 1ST FEBRUARY






THE PATRIARCHS BY ANGELA SAINI HISTORY/EQUALITY – 29TH FEBRUARY

Duckworth Books £10.99






CHAPTERS BY TIM KEY POETRY - 14TH FEBRUARY




