





A LINE IN THE SAND by Kevin Powers


FICTION - 18TH APRIL Sceptre £9.99

FICTION - 25th APRIL Transworld £9.99






THE AXEMAN'S CARNIVAL by Catherine Chidgey

THE BORROWED HILLS by SCOTT PRESTON


FICTION - 11TH APRIL John Murray £16.99

FICTION - 4TH APRIL Vintage £9.99




DEATH OF A BOOKSELLER by alice slater



SCIENCE- 4TH APRIL Vermilion £10.99






STILL LIFE WITH BONES by Alexa Hegarty


