



#### PLAYGROUND by Richard Powers fiction - 26th Sept


#### Cornerstone £20


# THE EMPUSIUM by OLGA TOKARCZUK FICTION - 26TH SEPT

#### A DARK AND DROWNING TIDE by Alison Saft Fiction - 17th Sept


#### Daphne Press £19.99





#### WELLNESS by Nathan Hill






#### THE NIGHT OF BABA YAGA by Akira Otani Fiction - 12th Sept

# MAD WOMAN by Chelsea Bieker fiction - 5th Sept


#### Oneworld £16.99


#### DEAR DICKHEAD by Virginie Despentes fiction - 18th Sept



#### AROUND THE WORLD IN 80 GAMES by Marcus Du Sautoy Maths - 1st Sept






#### FEATHER & CLAW by Marta Palazzesi Children's - 26th Sept




