


THE MODERN FAIRIES by Clare Pollard fiction - 3rd April


AUDITION by Katie Kitamura fiction - 17th April




IDLE GROUNDS by Krystelle Bamford






LOVERS OF FRANZ K. by Burhan Sonmez fiction - 10th April

BACK IN THE DAY by OLIVER LOVRENSKI FICTION - 17TH APRIL


Penguin Books £14.99




EVENINGS AND WEEKENDS by Oisin McKenna


FICTION - 24TH APRIL



When Chilean dictator Agustin Pinochet was arrested in London in 1998, Sands was a young lawyer asked to represent him. But when he told his wife the news, he could never imagine the family connections he had to the despot's crimes against humanity. More brilliant narrative non-fiction from the *East West Street* author.




CATLAND by Kathryn Hughes History - 24th April






EVERYTHING MUST GO by Dorian Lynskey Literature- 10th April




AVERY AND THE FAIRY CIRCLE by ROWAN KINGSBURY YOUNG READERS - 3RD APRIL



Oneworld £7.99


