



JESUS CHRIST KINSKI by BENJAMIN MYERS HB-£18.99-BLOOMSBURY







NIC'S FAVE: DUSK by ROBBIE ARNOTT HB - £16.99 - CHATTO & WINDUS



A wild puma roams a distorted version of the Tasmanian highlands. Twins Iris and Floyd are on its trail - lured by the bounty on its head and hindered by the reckless greed of other trackers. **Nic says:** "Let's begin at the end. *Dusk's* last scenes are all you could want from a finale. Before then Arnott weaves a stunning tale of loyalty, betrayal, desperation, the thin line between man and beast, and the ties that bind."



WILD DARK SHORE by CHARLOTTE MCCONAGHY PB-£9.99 - CANONGATE

On the subantarctic island of Shearwater, the Salt family toil as caretakers for an underground seed bank. Climate change and recent disaster on the island endanger not just the project but the family's sanity. Their isolation and secrets are broken by the arrival of Rowan, who washes ashore looking for her husband, and becomes equally trapped. A thrilling story of second chances and the humbling power of the natural world.



NETHMI'S FAVE: THE BOOK OF GUILT by CATHERINE CHIDGEY HB - £20 - JOHN MURRAY



England, 1979. Triplets Vincent, William, and Lawrence are the last remaining residents of the Captain Scott Home for Boys. Under the watchful eyes of three Mothers, they dream of being cured of the mysterious Bug and joining their friends in Margate. But when the government shuts down the home, the boys begin to understand that they've been lied to their whole lives... **Nethmi says:** "An eerie alternate history novel steeped in equal parts mystery and tragedy."



IDLE GROUNDS by KRYSTELLE BAMFORD HB - £16.99 - HUTCHINSON HEINEMANN

On a bright summer's day in 1980s New England, three-year-old Abi goes missing on the grounds of her aunt's estate during a family gathering. Whilst their parents bicker and talk politics, it's up to a troop of Abi's cousins to embark on a quest to find her. But the deeper they walk, the more threatening the woods become. Whimsical, unique, and endlessly playful, this is a perfect read for fans of Susanna Clarke's *Piranesi*.




LUCY CARMICHAEL by MARGARET KENNEDY PB-£12.99-PENGUIN

Kennedy's rediscovered novel The Feast was republished in 2020 to universal acclaim - and a place on the Mr B's bestseller list. Lucy Carmichael is every bit as brilliant, telling the story of a young woman who, after being jilted at the altar, abandons her suburban home for a life in the country, where she finds solace in a stimulating new job and gossipy colleagues. A charming and wonderful coming-of-age tale perfect for winter nights.




FALL, BOMB, FALL by GERRIT KOUWENAAR PB - £12.99 - PUSHKIN PRESS

Dutch teenager Karel is sick of hearing about impending war on the radio, tired of everyone around him discussing it - he's more interested in the girl he's just fallen for. If war is coming, let it come! That is, until he's walking around town and a bomb almost claims his life, sending this naïve young man on a crash course with history. Catch-22 meets The Catcher in the Rye in this charming, rediscovered coming-of-age novel.



ED'S FAVE: HARD RAIN FALLING by DON CARPENTER PB-£10.99-PENGUIN CLASSICS

Jack Levitt navigates gritty pool halls and brutal prisons, repeatedly coming into the orbit of the enigmatic Billy Lancing. When they become cellmates, it becomes apparent this relationship could offer a different kind of life for Jack. Ed says: "Taking in the sweep of one man's life from his pregnant mother's wild arrival in town, through his criminally spiralling youth to finally finding a kind of peace, this is an intense and deeply affecting hardboiled story."



THE CAT by GEORGES SIMENON PB-£10.99 - PENGUIN CLASSICS

Émile and Marguerite live in uncomfortable silence in their Paris apartment, while the din of life screams on outside. After marrying in their 60s, the pair lived in peace – that is, until Émile's beloved cat disappeared. Thinking Marguerite the culprit, he immediately took revenge on her parrot, leading to a life of spite and silence, where they now communicate only by petty notes. A tense portrait of a poisoned marriage by the French master.



A LONG WINTER by COLM TÓIBÍN **HB-£12.99-PICADOR**

Based on true events in Catalonia twenty years after the Spanish Civil War, Tóibín tells a story of a father and son surviving in the wake of grief, loneliness, and loss. After a fight with his father, Miquel's mother walks out of their home high up in the Pyrenees and does not return, leaving them to battle the harsh winter, and their resentment of each other, alone, until an unexpected arrival brings the promise of hope.



TIME OF THE CHILD by NIALL WILLIAMS PB-£9.99-BLOOMSBURY

In the small Irish town of Faha, the doctor and his eldest daughter live together in polite silence, their love and loyalty comforting yet stifling. Shortly before Christmas, their world and relationship is transformed by the arrival of a baby left in their care. Ronnie discovers within herself a purpose beyond her disappointed dreams, whilst her father juggles with community gossip in a desperate attempt to shield his family.




ADVENT by GUNNAR GUNNARSSON HB-£12.99-VINTAGE CLASSICS

Every winter during Advent, Benedikt risks the perilous Nordic mountains to rescue sheep lost in the wintry blizzards. His only companions are a loyal dog who can sense wayward sheep through the storms before Benedikt can, and a ram that leads them to safety. Translated into English for the first time in 90 years, this drama of selfless endurance for the greater good is an Icelandic classic akin to A Christmas Carol.



THE CHRISTMAS CLUE by NICOLA UPSON HB-£10-FABER & FABER

The Pratts have planned a Christmas to die for. It's 1943 in a snowy English village and despite the war shortages, Anthony and Elva Pratt have prepared a murder mystery game for some festive cheer. But when they get to the Tudor Close Hotel, they are faced with the real thing: a shocking murder that needs solving before it's too late. A delightful cosy crime novel loosely based on the true story of the couple who invented Cluedo.



HISTORICAL FICTION &

THE WINTER WARRIORS by OLIVIER NOREK HB - £18.99 - OPEN BORDERS PRESS

Finland, 1939. When the conscription officer arrives at the peaceful village of Rautjärvi with news of Soviet invasion, few can imagine what is to come, least of all young Simo, who is about to become the most legendary and feared sniper in the world. Combining real-life figures with thrilling storytelling, this epic and brilliantly researched


novel is perfect for Robert Harris and Ben Macintryre fans.

Lai lives in a small Beijing flat with her parents, younger brother, and grandparents. Her father is a sunken figure haunted by what happened in the Cultural Revolution. As Lai grows older, she begins to understand the history of both her family and her country. When she earns a place at a prestigious university, she joins student protests, convinced change is in the air... A big, sweeping family saga for fans of *Pachinko*.



KATE'S FAVE: THE EIGHTS by JOANNA MILLER HB - £16.99 - FIG TREE

Oxford, 1920. Dora, Marianne, Otto, and Beatrice are part of the first class of women who are allowed to matriculate at Oxford University. This is a time when everything is changing—the shadow of WWI looms large, and the threat of the Spanish Flu hasn't yet been chased away. **Kate says:** "In this powerful and moving story, Miller's skill is in the distinctive voice she crafts for each character, which has you rooting for them through the adversity they face."



COSTANZA by RACHEL BLACKMORE PB - £9.99 - RENEGADE BOOKS

Costanza Piccolomini has been noticed by renowned sculptor Gianlorenzo Bernini, whose affections draw her away from herself and into the world of notoriety. Their relationship quickly grows, their attraction unyielding, and Costanza soon learns that for a woman in Roman society, affection comes with a price. A gripping retelling of a 17th-century silenced woman, complete with blackmail, ferocity and rage.



THE HOUSE OF WOLF by TONY ROBINSON HB - £25 - SPHERE

The High Court of Aethelwulf stands on the brink of collapse. Moving between Anglo-Saxon Wessex and 9th-century Rome, national treasure Sir Tony Robinson paints a vivid portrait of European Christendom in crisis, as warring siblings battle for the crown and the Vikings begin their assault overseas. Thus begins an epic struggle between greed and morality, ambition and betrayal, freedom and tyranny: because change always meets with conflict, and on the path to power, no one can be trusted.








THE ADVERSARY by MICHAEL CRUMMEY PB - £9.99 - SERPENT'S TAIL








FANTASY & SCI-FI

AUTOMATIC NOODLE by ANNALEE NEWITZ HB - £14.99 - TOR PUBLISHING

A near-future novella about four robots, a human, and a car who open up a noodle shop in a futuristic post-war San Francisco, in newly independent California. When an anonymous comment sparks a review bombing frenzy, our heroes must think outside the wok and rebuild from the ground up. A charming, cosy sci-fi for fans of Becky Chambers and TJ Klune, with delicious food writing and a political undercurrent simmering beneath the surface.



HENRY'S FAVE: JUICE by TIM WINTON

A man and child traverse a ruined landscape in future Australia, when they are taken at crossbow-point and caged. Realising his only hope of escape lies in establishing a rapport with his captor, the man tell his story: a tale of a childhood lived in a place ravaged by uninhabitable temperatures and strange beings, where to survive he had to do the unthinkable. Henry says: "A moving and thrilling SF novel from the Australian master."



FREEZING POINT by ANDERS BODELSEN PB-£9.99-FABER & FABER

When young magazine editor Bruno discovers he has an incurable cancer, he thinks his days are numbered. But his doctor offers him a unique opportunity: to be cryogenically frozen and suspend his life until a cure is discovered. Bruno agrees, but will the world he wakes up in be the same as the one he remembers? A rediscovered, darkly comic Danish dystopian classic that portrays the beauty of life and death by removing the possibility of the latter.



CLEM'S FAVE: WILLIAM by MASON COILE PB-£9.99-BASKERVILLE

If successful, she will win a place amongst the mages of the city of Tiran, a city wholly dependent on magic and protected by a wall that keeps out the Blight. Sciona soon finds unexpected friendship in refugee Thomil, who reveals the true nature of the city she has naïvely revered. Deliciously dark academia fantasy for fans of Leigh Bardugo and R.F. Kuang.



In the miserable village of East Grasby, Isabella Nagg divides her time between her lazy lout of a husband and her wandering donkey. When Mr Nagg brings home a stolen book from the local wizard, Isabella wonders what harm a little magic could do? This debut novel from a beloved rare bookseller is cosy and witty, full of Pratchett-esque footnotes, and set in a world of goblins, sentient animals, and talking plants, of course!






THE GNOME BOOK by LOES RIPHAGEN HB - £12.99 - PUSHKIN CHILDREN'S (AGE 5+)


HANNAH'S FAVE: DRAGONBORN by STRUAN MURRAY HB - £14.99 - PUFFIN (AGE 9+)


TEEN & YOUNG ADULT
