




DEATH AND THE GARDENER by GEORGI GOSPODINOV







FLASHLIGHT by SUSAN CHOI FICTION - 26TH FEB




THE PUMA by DANIEL WILES FICTION - 12TH FEB



Feeling stifled by pressure and grief, struggling writer Anna retreats to the marshes of rural England, hoping to find the inspiration to write her new novel. Instead, Anna stumbles across the centuries-old body of a young woman preserved in the bog, and slowly descends into obsession. A poetic and visceral adult debut from a beloved children's author.

Simon has always done his best to do right by those around him. But when his new flatmate Massimo moves in, he brings with him the smell of earth and meat, strange sounds echoing from his room, and the beginnings of a wild awakening within Simon. A modern horror novel for anyone who's had a flatmate they'd rather forget.



A BEAST SLINKS TOWARDS BEIJING by ALICE EVELYN YANG FICTION - 19TH FEB

When her father returns to her childhood home, Quianze barely recognises the fragile, haunted man before her. But when he begins to speak of his past, of their family's dark history, Quianze falls under a spell woven with mythology and a looming curse. A magical realist family saga spanning decades of trauma and colonial legacy.

EVERY ONE STILL HERE by LIADAN NI CHUINN FICTION - 12TH FEB

From a brand new voice in Irish literature comes six short stories, intimate and political in their scope. A young man struggles with his anatomy class. A little girl spends her days on a bus. A bride prays to the bones of St Valentine. Snapshots of the everyday are rendered with great compassion and tied to the history of the Troubles in this visceral collection.




CODE NOIR by CANISIA LUBRIN FICTION - 5TH FEB

Based on the fifty-nine articles of the Code Noir—a decree passed by King Louis XIV on the treatment of French colonial slaves in the Caribbean—Lubrin presents fifty-nine interconnected short fictions exploring the reality of Black experience, both past and present. An electrifying and audacious response to an artifact of colonial injustice.

LOOKING AT WOMEN, LOOKING AT WAR by VICTORIA AMELINA AUTOBIOGRAPHY - 12TH FEB


HarperCollins £10.99


LEAVING HOME by MARK HADDON MEMOIR - 5TH FEB

RED POCKERS by ALICE MAH MEMOIR - 5TH FEB




BETWEEN TWO RIVERS by MOUDHY AL-RASHID HISTORY - 12TH FEB


Hodder & Stoughton £12.99


TINY HERCULES by JON LOCK & NICH ANGELL GRAPHIC NOVEL - 5TH FEB


